Pastor's Note:

Beautiful Word

The other day I was walking Wesley along the lake walk in Tofte Park, admiring the ice-castle shapes of the ice as the waves broke on the rocks. The snow was falling softly, giving the spruce a fresh coat of white against their dark green boughs. I was struck again by the beauty of God's creation. I don't tend to be too worried about whether he accomplished it in a day or an epoch, He spoke his Word, and it was beautiful and good.

When I got back to the church I put on one of the "Joyce Plays Songs from the North Shore" CDs featuring Joyce Krueger's piano music. Beautiful.

During my studies for our messages on Islam this month I'd been reading the work of Christian historians describing the ancient textual evidence for the Christian story: that Jesus was born, He was crucified, and His disciples saw Him alive again. One of them described how we have enough manuscript fragments from the first century that we can re-assemble nearly the entire New Testament. The more archeologists discover, the more they confirm the basic truths of Christianity. He said it was "beautiful".



Five years ago the English speaking world celebrated the 400th anniversary of the publication of the King James Bible. Praised for its accuracy in translating the original Greek and Hebrew, and for the beauty

of its style, it set the standard for the English language well into the last century. Since 2011 there has been an explosion of new bible translations, each attempting to capture the beauty of the KJV but in modern English.

One of these is the NIrV, a Bible in simple, easy to read English. Another is the popular ESV, a literal translation somewhat like the KJV, but without the "thees" and "thous". Another, the "God's Word" version, was originally developed by a group of Lutherans! Reading one of these new translations is a great way to hear anew our story: the story of God becoming man to live among us, show us how to live, and pay the price of our sin for us.


God's Word is truly beautiful. It speaks to us in creation and through music. It speaks through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and it speaks through the pages of the Bible today just as powerfully as it did 400 years ago and 1400 years ago.

So, putting this all together: the next time I go walking, I might just show up at your door to introduce myself, share with you a copy of the New Testament in one of these new translations (a gift from Zoar Church), and invite you to come and join us for worship. You might want to pick up a copy of Joyce's CD while you are here! Perhaps we will sing "Beautiful Savior" and you can learn again, along with me, how amazingly beautiful is his love for His creation, including (and especially for) you and me.

A Case for Smiles

I am looking back at 2015 and all the wonderful memories I have of last year. On top of my list of favorite memories is seeing all the pillow cases you made and donated to A Case for Smiles.

I delivered my final 2015 delivery to St. Mary's Children's Hospital on December 27th. Two nurses met Eric and me with a wagon, and we filled it with six grocery bags full of pillow cases. The nurses asked that we thank all of you and said "their children" loved the cases. I always find it so interesting when they say "their children" and never do they say "their patients". I find their terminology very sweet.

I want to share with you that in August, when I made my delivery, my bins ended up empty! I wondered what I had gotten myself into; starting this program for Northern Minnesota \St. Mary's Children's Hospital and not being able to keep it going. In a panic, had a long



talk with God. I told him if he wanted this project to continue I needed help. During September's Challenge, pillow cases came in by mail from all over Minnesota! Eric picked up a beautiful donation from a church in Morris, Minnesota while he was on a hunting trip

last Fall. Eighth graders, learning to sew, sent in their pillow cases from more then one school around Minnesota. Imagine the life lesson they learned giving those pillow cases to sick children less fortunate then themselves. I was amazed by their gift.

Each year our donations to St. Mary's Children's Hospital has risen and each year the hospital uses every last pillow case and often runs out before my next delivery.

The Pediatric Floor is where I deliver the cases. Sometimes the pillow cases are used in the NICU to cover tiny matresses. Pediatric Day Surgery has even been able to use your pillow cases from time to time.

In the four years we've been up and running in northern Minnesota, your generous hearts have donated over 4,300 pillow cases to St. mary's Children's Hospital. On behalf of all those sick children I say a huge and heartfelt "THANK YOU!" Just think of the smiles you've created.

The Malawi Project

We are collecting used perscription bottles. These bottles will be sent to Malawi and used by rural clinics, hospitals and pharmacies. Please remove the labels and wash the bottles. They will be given to people who walk, often a long distance, to get their medications.

There is a basket in the narthex of Zoar Church for these bottles. Little gifts often add-up to big blessings!

Evergreen Mission Congregation

During the month of February, Zoar church will be supporting the Evergreen Mission Congregation in Saipan. Evergreen is a congregation of Chinese, Phillippino, and native Chamorro members on the Pacific island of Saipan in the US territory of the Northern Marianas. Pastor Daren had an opportunity to lead two mission teams from Korea to work with their Pastor Joshua Seo several years ago. Sadly, their church in the San Antonio district of Saipan was destroyed by Typhoon Soudelor last August. Pastor Seo and congregation leaders have located a new building but need help funding a remodel to turn it into a worship and education space. In March Zoar will once again be supporting the Cook County Food Shelf.



Good Friday is March 25 when we nail even our own sins to the cross. Both services are at 6:30.

Final Words from the Cross

As he hung on a Roman instrument of torture, the gospels record Jesus speaking seven times to those nearby. Jesus' words were as powerful during his ministry among first century Judeans as they are for twenty-first century Americans. Even as He hung upon the cross his words carried meaning. During this season of lent we will explore one of these sayings each sunday - from the viewpoint of those who witnessed his death as well as for our lives today.

"Today You Will Be with Me in Paradise."

"I Thirst."

"It Is Finished."
