On December 31, 1905 Zoar Lutheran Church was officially established. Zoar is an uncommon name for a church. It's also an uncommon name in the Bible. In the Hebrew language Zoar means "small." In the days of Abraham, early in the Old Testament, a town just south of the Dead Sea bore that name. It is likely that the founders chose the name Zoar because of what Zoar was for the ancient Hebrews-a place of refuge. It was fitting in 2006, our 100th anniversary, to celebrate under the motto "A Place of Refuge-Past, Present, and Future."
