#### **Upcoming Messages**

Martin Luther used the symbol of the five petaled rose to represent the faith of the 16th century reformation. Each petal represented a "sola" - a Greek word for "only" or "alone." These solas summarized the truths of the Bible as Luther and his fellow reformers understood it: "We are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in the finished work of Christ alone. Everything I need for a life of faith can be found in Scripture alone, and because of all of this I glorify God alone." From the very beginnings of the Jesus movement, followers of Christ have sought to summarize their faith through statements called "creeds" or "confessions." One of these is the Apostle's Creed. Another is the Augsburg Confession, an important foundational document in Zoar's heritage. These symbols, creeds, and confessions are all an attempt to answer the question "Who Are We?" Who are we as people of God and followers of Christ and what does this mean in terms of how we interact within our community?

This fall we will be exploring that very question, using the five solas, the Apostle's Creed and the Augsburg confession as jumping off points. We live in a topsy turvy world where the label Christian has as many negative connotations for some as it has positive for others. We won't shy away from tackling some of our modern dilemmas like Christian Nationalism and the rise of the "nones" while we seek to explore from the life of Jesus exactly who we are if we claim to follow Him.

Join us each **Sunday** from **9:30 am - 10:30 am.** Coffee and goodies are served following the worship service. Come as you are. *All are welcome*.

#### **Land Sale Update**



In 1972 Mathilde (Billie) Peterson bequeathed 80 acres in *Superior National Forest* not far from Tait Lake to Lutsen and Zoar Lutheran Churches. Though her wish was for this land to be used as "a place where children's minds are filled with the wonders of God's Creation," our two congregations found it difficult over the years to utilize this densely forested and wetland property for

retreat or recreation purposes. A joint committee of the two churches was formed in the fall of 2021 to explore the possibility of selling this land while hoping to honor the spirit of Ms. Peterson's gift. In the end KGM Contractors offered an agreeable bid for all 80 acres and both congregations approved the sale in congregational meetings in August. At Zoar's Annual Meeting in September, the congregation passed a resolution to form a committee to determine how to best utilize the proceeds of the land sale to benefit the future of the congregation and the children of the community. #### Samaritan's Purse

~October Mission Project ~

Zoar Church is supporting Samaritan's Purse as our Mission Project during the month of October. U.S. disaster relief units have tractor-trailers that are stocked with heavy-duty tarps, generators, chain-saws and other tools to aid in cleanup efforts. The team maintains a constant state of readiness - monitoring weather conditions and emerging threats around the nation in order to respond at a moment's notice to help victims of natural disasters. Samaritan's Purse is working with those affected by Hurricane Ian. Disaster relief units arrived in Fort Myers and Englewood on September 30th. Volunteers are already working to mud-out flooded homes, cut downed trees, remove debris, and tarp roofs.

#### CHUM

#### ~November Mission Project ~

Churches United in Ministry (CHUM) serves more than 8,000 low-income, homeless, hungry, isolated, or otherwise marginalized community members throughout the Duluth area each year. CHUM has 40 member congregations and offers emergency food, shelter, advocacy, support, and street outreach.

CHUM is Duluth's primary safety-net organization where people who are homeless or who have low incomes can go for assistance and a safe community. CHUM also operates Duluth's largest food shelf. CHUM has a Drop-In Center where people can pick up mail, do their laundry, eat a hot meal, and socialize.
