Pastor's Corner

Don't Worry; Don't Judge

Through His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus taught His followers many remarkable things. Two that have particular application in this time of political divide are: do not worry and do not judge.

So, about worry – Matthew 6:25 records (along with other verses) that Jesus tells His followers, ‘do not worry’. In fact, worry and faith are inversely related; the more you worry the less faith you have and, the more faith you have the less you will worry. Now, don’t confuse worry and concern. Worry is emotional, dwelling on “what ifs”. Worry can paralyze you, lead to stress, and mentally drain you. Concern is rational; it is action-oriented awareness of a potential problem. Concern focuses on what’s controllable. Worry just wrings its hands and frets.

A concerned person who sees water dripping from the ceiling gets a bucket to catch the water and makes a plan to fix the roof. A worrier stares at the puddle, frets about the roof, fears the potential damage and stresses about losing the house!

Jesus tells us to face our problems, act on what we can control then leave the rest to God and trust Him for the solution. And Jesus will help you, but you need to ask and work with Him. Maybe the solution is getting off social media, quit watching the news or, like me, avoid watching certain content on TV that causes you to worry when you have absolutely no hope of fixing it.

And about judging – In one verse (of several), Matthew 7:1, Jesus tells His followers in no uncertain terms, “Do not judge”. We, as believers, are not to judge another person’s salvation or their heart. While we may see wrong actions; we are not to call another evil or feel justified to hate them. Here are twelve reasons not to judge other people:

It’s easy to misjudge the situation

You may not have all the facts

You don’t really understand another person’s weakness

You cannot fully understand the difficulty of a person’s situation

You may not understand another’s motivation

Some judge others as an excuse to avoid doing the right thing

Some judge when they actually have the same fault

Some judge to avoid dealing with their own faults

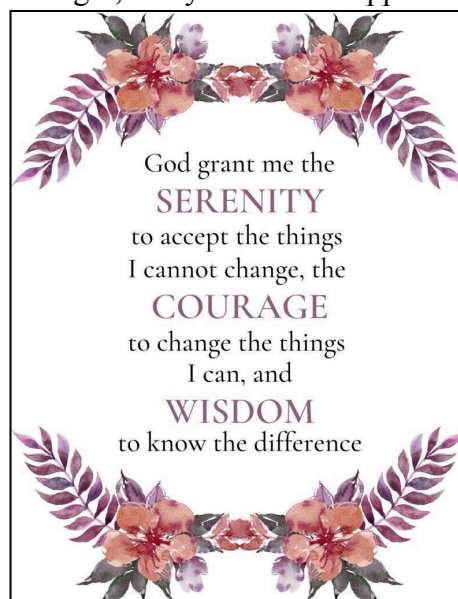
Sometimes it makes us feel superior to judge another. That’s called prejudice.

Some judgment is gossip. Gossip is evil (not the person, the action).

You are not better than the person you are judging

You are not impartial

God is the righteous Judge. So please, follow hard after Jesus, pray for your enemies, replace worry with faith and treat others with love and mercy. You will sleep better at night, and you will be happier.

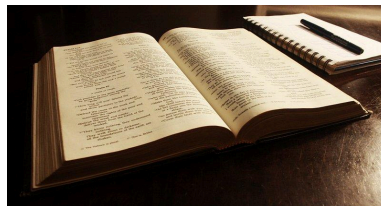

Chosen People Ministries

~ March Mission Project ~



Chosen People Ministries is a mission to Jewish people around the world to support their community and culture and teach about Jesus the Messiah. Zoar donations go to the regional center in the Twin Cities and Duluth to support those Jewish communities and further understanding of Jesus.

Global Health Ministries

~ April Mission Project ~

Throughout the year Zoar Church supports several missions and ministries locally and throughout the world. All of these have some sort of connection to our congregation. The ministry we will support in April is Global Health Ministries (GHM), a program a former Zoar pastor has been with for several years. GHM is a non-profit, volunteer-powered organization that supports global Lutheran efforts in healthcare.



This month, mission donations to GHM will be directed to their work in El Salvador.

GHM works with volunteer Community Health Promoters (CHP) to provide first aid supplies and basic hygiene kits so that the CHP can teach the communities about first aid, sanitation, malaria prevention, reproductive health, and nutrition.

Mission Highlights

Bishop Kishore is one of the missionaries Zoar has supported over the past several years. He has blessed us when he visits with Indian food and inspiring sermons. Bishop Kishore is responsible for planting 17 churches in the Indian state of Andhra Pradesh; each church reaches more than 200 people at weekly worship services. Recently we learned Bishop Kishore was invited to speak to a group of over 1500 at an open air meeting (maybe something like a Billy Graham event) and he personally baptized more than 11 people. This is remarkable in a country where less than 5% of people are Christians.

Zoar is proud to be able to support God's work through Bishop Kishore's ministry. Please pray for his churches and pastors as Christian persecution has been increasing in Andhra Pradesh. Churches and Christian evangelists have been attacked, including a recent incident where a minibus carrying evangelists was destroyed.

On other missions news, Zoar was pleased to be able to provide hats and mittens to Safe Haven Shelter in Duluth. We're on track to deliver 20+ pairs of new wool socks, gently used wool hats and more thanks to the generosity of those clearing out their storage. These items will go a long way to helping those in need.
